FOUR CORNERS WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT MINUTES DRAFT REGULAR MEETING, April 15, 2025

Call to Order

President Nancy Flikkema called the regular meeting of the Four Corners Water and Sewer District (FCWSD) to order at 6:29 pm on April 15, 2025, at the office of the Four Corners Water & Sewer District at 495 Quail Run Road, Bozeman, Montana.

Staff/Public present: Phil George, General Manager (GM) from FCWSD; Amy Ellingson, District Administrator (DA) from FCWSD and Libby Kueneke, Secretary

Approval of Minutes

February 18, 2025 Board Meeting

Motion: Member Jeff Sipes moved to approve the Minutes as written. Member Justin Hart seconded. No public comment occurred. The Minutes were approved 5-0.

No public comment occurred.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Ordinance 2025-01 2nd Reading

Ordinance 2025-01: An Ordinance Accepting the Annexation Petition of Pipeline Boomer Properties, LLC Lot 7A of Amended Plat of Tract A for annexation into the Four Corners Water and Sewer District

The property is located adjacent to the Corner Post. The petition is for 5 sewer only EDUs. Phil recommends approval.

Motion: Member Jeff Sipes moved to pass the 2nd reading of Ordinance 2025-01; member Justin Hart seconded. No public comment occurred. Motion passed 5-0.

Ordinance 2025-02 2nd Reading

Ordinance 2025-02: An Ordinance Accepting the Annexation Petition of the Cancro Property, Lot 2 & 3 of Minor 525 A-235 for annexation into the Four Corners Water and Sewer District

The property is located in the Cool Water subdivision. The petition is for 3 sewer only EDUs. Phil recommends approval.

Motion: Member Jeff Sipes moved to pass the 2nd reading of Ordinance 2025-02; member Justin Hart seconded. No public comment occurred. Motion passed 5-0.

Ordinance 2025-03 1st Reading

Ordinance 2025-03: An Ordinance Accepting the Annexation Petition of John Rosa, Lot 48 for annexation into the Four Corners Water and Sewer District

The property is located in Rainbow Subdivision. The petition is for 1 EDU. Phil recommends approval.

Motion: Member Michelle Piazza moved to pass the 1st reading of Ordinance 2025-03; member Justin Hart seconded. No public comment occurred. Motion passed 3-0.

Resolution 2025-02: Increasing Additional Water Charge

Resolution 2025-02: A Resolution of the Four Corners County Water and Sewer to increase

Only the excess water rate will change to encourage conservation while the base rate will stay the same. The water variable rate will be adjusted by volume tiers from 4.5% to 4.95%. The DA will inform all homeowners via mail of the changes. Increases will take effect June 2025 billing cycle.

Motion: Member Michelle Piazza moved to approve Resolution 2025-02; Member Jeff Sipes seconded. No public comment occurred. Motion passed 5-0.

March PCC Triangle Project Meeting

Phil George reported on information he shared at the meeting.

- The GM reported on steps taken while serving GGWSD. GGWSD's discharge capacity and subsequent growth rate are limited by FCWSD's discharge capacity.
- The GM discussed FCWSDs discharge, water, and system status, and the district's future plan.
- The GM reported on the FCWSD facility status.

Monthly Financial Report

Amy Ellingson provided the report.

- The DA reviewed upcoming annexations. The Board, DA, and GM discussed communicating the status clearly with landowners with vacant properties.
- FCWSD employee insurance was renewed.
- FCWSD billed the first \$80/EDU for contracted clients above and beyond the 4 year contractual EDU purchase. The board requested a monthly report on billed vs. collected. The Board asked at what point unpaid bills will result in a lien on property. The DA will look into if a time threshold already has been decided and will report back at the next Meeting.
- The Stip Bond water status is at \$2,560,392 and sewer status is at \$450,044.
- The DA reviewed the March 2025 budget vs. actual for the shared, sewer, and water expenses.

Monthly Operations and Maintenance Report

Phil George offered the report.

- The WRF SBR 5 startup is scheduled for April/May 2025.
- The Tertiary Filtration electrical installation is complete, the garage door is installed, and the work platform is complete. Instrumentation continues.
- All the Odor Control Improvement equipment is installed, and startup will occur in June or July.
- 80% of the new water line for the Zoot Water Main Extension is complete. The contractor needs to jack and bore under Norris Road, which will begin in May.
- The Northstar Lift Station construction started February 10th.
- The augmentation upgrade has been started and will be completed in April.
- The Valley Center building enlargement started.

General Manager Topics

Phil George offered the report.

- The current capacity status is at 895 EDUs.
- The GM reviewed images of the construction and installation progress for the Board.

Board Member Topics

The Elk Grove timeline to become operational is three years away as the district's new capacity allows them to avoid running two processing plants when one suffices.

ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE ANNEXATION PETITION OF JOHN ROSA, Lot 48 of the Rainbow Subdivision of Bozeman Hot Springs Tract, BOZEMAN, MT 59718, GALLATIN COUNTY MONTANA INTO THE FOUR CORNERS WATER & SEWER DISTRICT

WHEREAS JOHN ROSA, with address of 480 Cherry Ave, Bozeman, MT 59718 as owner of the Property described herein, submitted a petition for annexation of a parcel of land described as Lot 48 of the Rainbow Subdivision of Bozeman Hot Springs Tract, located in Section 14, T02 S, R04 E, Gallatin County Montana hereinafter also referred to as "Property" requesting that the Property be annexed into the Four Corners County Water and Sewer District; and

WHEREAS, the Property is contiguous to the District boundary; and

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2025 at a duly noticed meeting of the Board of Directors, the Board considered the Petition to annex the Property as contiguous property and determined that the systems will have sufficient future capacity to provide service to the Property.

WHEREAS, the JOHN ROSA, agrees to pay the capacity fees for one (1) Equivalent Dwelling Units ("EDUs"), with an EDU equal to a maximum daily flow of 160 gallons per day and average daily flow of 160 gallons per day per EDU. The District shall not provide sewer service in excess of the capacity provided herein. The District shall not provide water and shall not provide water service for any purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board by passage of this ordinance does agree to annex the Property described as Lot 48 of the Rainbow Subdivision of Bozeman Hot Springs Tract, located in Section 14, T02 S, R04 E,, Gallatin County into the District to provide sewer service to the Property not to exceed equal to a maximum daily flow of 160 gallons a day and average daily flow of 160 gallons per day per EDU (one EDU). All recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as if fully set forth herein.

WHEREAS, TWG BOZEMAN, LLC, with address of 1413 E.
